THE KING JAMES BIBLE ANNIVERSARY:

- This Sunday our readings will be taken from the King James Bible.

- Sunday 9th October at 6.00pm there will be a special "Songs of Praise" service. The readings and hymns will be chosen in advance by the members of the congregation – the King James Version of the Bible will be used for all the readings. Please note that there will be no Morning Worship service on this day.

- Sunday 16th October at 9.30am there will be a service of Holy Communion at which the readings will be read in two forms. The King James Version of the Old Testament reading and the gospel passage will be read, each of them followed by a modern version – a dramatised version of the gospel passage will be used.

- Sunday 23rd October (Bible Sunday) at 11.00am there will be the normal Family Service. The reading used for the theme of the service will be read from the King James version of the bible followed by the reading taken from a modern bible.

There will be an autumn tidy-up of the Church and Churchyard on Saturday 29th October, starting at 10.00am. Please put the date in your diary and come along and help, for as little or as long as you would like. All help will be much appreciated.
