AUTUMN JOBS AROUND THE CHURCHYARD

- 1. Gently remove all moss and vegetation from the base of the church walls and surface gutters.
- 2. Cut suckers from the base of the tree trunks on either side of the church path.
- 3. Dig out any brambles and ragwort on the north side of the church.
- 4. Weed and tidy up the road round the war memorial and notice board.
- 5. Remove weeds and cut out and treat the tree saplings (if possible with Root Rot or SBK) growing in amongst the large tomb on the north west corner of the church.
- 6. Clear all ivy growing on the walls and fences at the west end of the church (but not any overhanging branches).
- 7. Gently remove all vegetation growing in the churchyard wall to the south and east of the churchyard (adjoining Church Lane).
