MACMILLAN COFFEE MORNING:

Great Brickhill held their tenth Macmillan Coffee Morning on Saturday 28th September. The first ever Coffee Morning, held in 2006 in the village bus shelter, made £321 and since then each year the village's Macmillan Coffee Morning has grown. The total raised this year is a fantastic £1,697.96, making the grand total for the ten years £10,062.66, thereby exceeding the target of £10k in ten years. Well done to all concerned.

The Little Princess Trust - Pauline Waller and Kate Johnson had grown their locks and had their hair cut just before the Macmillan Coffee Morning. They donated 12 inches of their hair to The Little Princess Trust who make wigs for children with cancer. In addition they raised £1,680.29 which they have donated to Macmillan.

The village's grand total going to Macmillan this year is £3,378.25.
