Since the last Newsletter in mid-December a number of successful events have been held in and around St Mary's Church:-

THE CHRISTMAS SERVICES:

On 17th December High Ash held their end of term School Christingle Service - the church was full to capacity.

Thank you to all those who helped with the preparation or took part in the Christmas Services and to those who decorated the church so beautifully. All three services were very well attended. The Family Service / Nativity was very successful - starting at the bottom of Pound Hill the crowd sang their way to the Church for a short service where the Nativity Scene was set. Many thanks go to the children for their participation, with the readings and the prayers.

The church was as usual full for the traditional Christmas Eve Carol Service. Special thanks to Juliet Bennett for organising the Order of Service and thanks to organist, Jerry Brisling, the choir for their wonderful singing and to all the readers.

On Christmas Day it was wonderful to welcome lots of young families among the congregation for our Christmas Day Holy Communion Service. The Rector made a presentation to Jerry Breslin, a book token in appreciation of all that Jerry does for us as choirmaster and organist.

THE CHRISTMAS FUNDRAISING EVENTS:

In addition to the Christmas Fair that as reported on in the last Newsletter there were other fundraising events:-

The Carol Singing around the village on the two Saturdays prior to Christmas raised a total of **£577.63** towards general church funds.

Our Christmas Charity Appeal was for L & D – NICU, the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) of Luton & Dunstable Hospital where Phoebe Read spent 177 days. A total of **£497** has been raised, including £297 from the Charity Songs of Praise. A note of thanks has been received from Jeni and Stuart Read thanking all at St. Mary's for their generosity in the wonderful amount collected for the charity, and for welcoming Phoebe and all the family into the community.

Sponsor a Light in aid of church funds has raised **£50**. Thank you to Emily Hudson for transcribing the dedications into the Commemoration Book. Thanks also to Michael and Julia Turner for providing the tree and to Stephen Anambra for erecting it and setting up the outdoor lights, a very welcoming sight on the approach to the church.

ASH WEDNESDAY, LENT & EASTER:

Due to the early date for Easter we are now moving quickly into the season of Lent. The **Ash Wednesday service** in the Benefice will be held next **Wednesday**, **10th February** - Holy Communion at St Luke's Church, **Stoke Hammond at 10.30am**. THE LENT COURSES:

The Psalms - "Prayers for Today's Church"

The ancient poems we call Psalms are over 2000 years old. They were written in very different times from our own when humans could travel at the speed of a camel - not at the speed of sound. But these songs have stood the test of time for they address many of the problems we still face: violence, injustice, anger - and bewilderment. In this 5-session course, Bishop Stephen Cottrell - a prolific and popular author - reflects on the psalms in general (and five psalms in particular – Psalms 100, 130, 13, 23 & 127).
