## A brief update on the position with the church roof.

You will all know that in October the church roof was targeted yet again and there is now virtually no lead left on the roof. The alarm system that we had hoped to have in place in September will no longer be installed. Our roofing contractor did a temporary repair to make the roof as water tight as possible. We now have permission to do the permanent repair in a substitute material and quotes are being obtained to carry out this work. It will doubtless be an expensive operation and it may be that the work has to be phased. An update will be circulated when more information is available.
