Consignments are sent several times a year to trouble spots as soon as a load is complete, so we know that the garments very quickly get to the point of need without lengthy periods sitting in warehouses. Babies are not the only age group the charity helps so if anyone would like to knit any other item of children's clothing (for a change!) they would be very gratefully received.

Of the 575 that our area collector amassed **we contributed 50**, they were very much appreciated. Previously these boxes were then collected from Milton Keynes and taken to the national depot in Worthing where they were checked and processed but this year there has been a change in logistics with regional depots being created; **with about 40,000 shoeboxes** to pack into lorries for their onward journey to Eastern Europe this development must ease the process!
