

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 13th June 2020

As of this weekend, churches are able to reopen for sociallydistanced private prayer. We will continue to provide information of on-line worship details for the foreseeable future, as group worship is still not yet possible under government public health guidance and there will be many among us who need to isolate for some time to come.



Whilst we rejoice in the fact that we can reopen our wonderful church for private prayer, it will be a few days before we can do safely so. The official guidance for using church buildings for individual private prayer was only published yesterday. There are a number of measures that have to be in place to ensure everyone's safety before the church is open again.

Reopening the church for private prayer is the first stage in getting back to how things were before the lockdown and being able to hold our regular services and activities. We are aware that the need for us to provide toilet facilities is now even more important as there is a greater need than ever before for hand washing facilities.

Included in the work outside we will be laying a gravel resin bonded pathway from the road gate to the West door extension.
