

# CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 20th June 2020

We are delighted to announce that as of this Sunday, 21st June the church will reopen for socially-distanced private prayer, albeit on a limited basis for the time being.

There has been much guidance given for the necessary preparation required for the church to be safely opened again. A number of measures have been put in place and the church will not look quite the same as in the past.

The church will initially be open for just two sessions per week in order that the building can be closed for 72 hours between opening times to minimise risk of infection. We will increase the opening times as soon as we feel it is safe to do so following the guidelines provided to us.

The church will be open on:

Sundays:- 10.00am - 2.00pm Wednesdays:- 2.00pm - 5.00pm

There is hand sanitizer available at the entrance and we ask that you read the guidance provided on the blue notice board as you enter the church. Much of the church has been cordoned off and all bibles, books etc have been removed. Please take your own bible or reading matter with you. There are chairs available near the altar should you wish to sit and say a prayer, or merely enjoy the wonderful space.

We would remind for those in vulnerable groups to check the current government guidelines. We will welcome all those to visit the church who feel comfortable to do so. The church will then be closed for a while for special cleaning to be done.

This reopening of the church for private prayer is the first stage in getting back to how things were before the lockdown and being able to hold our regular services and activities. We are aware that the need for us to provide toilet facilities is now even more important as there is a greater need than ever before for hand washing facilities.
