

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 27th June 2020

As you will know the Prime Minister announced on Monday that places of worship may re-open from 4th July, providing certain conditions are met and government guidance is followed. The government has also given permission for weddings to resume from the same date.

The detailed guidance from the government is still in preparation. Updated guidance from the national church will need to follow. It may, therefore, be some time before we have all the necessary information to begin to plan for physical services to start again. Each individual church will need to prepare carefully and there will be much to think through.

It is very welcome news that some of us will be able to meet again in our familiar and much-loved building. When we are able to do so this, it will be far from a return to normal life before lockdown but we will be able to start restoring and rebuilding some of what we have lost.

It is clear that we will not be in a position to hold services next weekend. When services do resume, whatever pattern of worship is offered, we will continue to share information on the virtual worship opportunities that are available.

CHURCH OPEN:

The church is currently open for just two sessions per week in order that the building can be closed for 72 hours between opening times to minimise risk of infection. The church is open on:
