

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 18th July 2020

Further to the Prime Minister's announcement that places of worship may reopen for worship from 4th July, it was agreed at the Benefice Wardens' Meeting on 16th July that in principle live services would be resumed in August, subject to the required approval by the PCC of each of the churches. There will be virtual services as well to cater for those who do not yet feel able to venture out to church. A full schedule will be provided next week.

When services do resume, whatever pattern of worship is offered, we will continue to share information on the weekly virtual worship opportunities that are available.

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY:
