CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 1st August 2020

As reported last week, it has been agreed that live services across the Benefice will resume in August. There will be one service per day at one of the churches on the first four Sundays in August at 11.00am. Although there cannot be any singing, the organ will be played at various points.

We are aware that there are many who have been shielding or in vulnerable groups who do not yet feel comfortable in going to public places. There will be occasional virtual services to cater for those who do not yet feel able to venture out to church and we will continue to share information on the virtual worship opportunities that are available each week both on radio and television, and livestreaming services

By the middle of August, we will have more of an idea as to what people might like and will be in a position to plan for services in September and beyond. We will be keeping a close eye on any changes to the guidelines and restrictions which may be issued by the government.

Tomorrow's service is at Stoke Hammond at 11.00am. Due to the social distancing rules there is a restriction on numbers, only 20 can attend.
