CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 8th August 2020

We are delighted to be able to hold the first service here in the village since the start of the lock down five months ago. It will be a service of Holy Communion at 11.00 am. Due to the restrictions there will be no singing but Jerry Breslin will be playing the organ at various points throughout the service.

Certain things will be a little different from normal. Hand sanitizing will be required on entry to the church and seating will be in accordance with social distancing rules. Masks are a mandatory requirement and we will be asking for contact details of all those attending, which we have to keep for 21 days.

There is one service per day at one of the churches on the first four Sundays in August at 11.00am. The full schedule of Services for August is at the end of this Newsletter. Next week there will be a Family Service at 11.00am at Little Brickhill.

We will soon have more of an idea as to what people might like in the form of services and will be in a position to plan for September and beyond. We will be keeping a close eye on any changes to the guidelines and restrictions which may be issued by the government.

We are very aware that there are some who will not yet be ready to come back to church but we look forward to welcoming those who feel that they are able to do so. There will be occasional virtual services to cater for those who do not yet feel able to venture out to church and we will continue to share information about the weekly virtual worship opportunities that are being either televised or live streamed from around the country. The information is posted each week at the church and is also uploaded onto the website in the dedicated Coronavirus section.

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE NINTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY:

The Rector's reflection and prayer is being recorded each week at different locations across the Benefice and these are available on You Tube. This week there is also a recording of the story, "Samuel Hears a Voice" read by Diane Webber.
