CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK Update 15th August 2020

NEWS OF LIVE SERVICES:

Tomorrow's service in the Benefice will be at 11am in Little Brickhill. This will be a Family Service and there will be a warm welcome for families from all four parishes. There is something on offer for people of all ages.

Due to the current government regulations, special arrangements have been made to safeguard everyone's health. The church has been reorganised to ensure appropriate distancing between family groups; anyone over the age of 11 will need to wear a face covering while inside the church and hand sanitizer, wipes and disposable gloves will be available. Contact details will be requested which will be keep for 21 days. Sadly, there cannot be any singing, but Jerry Breslin will be playing the organ. Weather permitting, outside in the churchyard there will be hot and cold drinks and a chance to stay and have a chat following the service.

NEXT SUNDAY'S SERVICE on 23rd August is at Bow Brickhill, Holy Communion at 11.00am.

THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY on 30th August will be a virtual service at 11.00am. It will be similar to the monthly Family Services. Anyone who would like to join in this service please contact Phillipa Cook for the log-in details.

SEPTEMBER SERVICES:

There will continue to be a limited number of services across the Benefice for the next two months. We are delighted that this year's Harvest Service will be held at Rectory Farm on Sunday 27th September, an 11.00am service followed by a bring your own picnic.

We are very aware that there are some who are not yet be ready to come back to services in church. There will be occasional virtual services to cater for those who do not yet feel able to venture out to church and we will continue to share information about the weekly virtual worship opportunities that are being either televised or live streamed from around the country. The information is posted each week at the church and is also uploaded onto the website in the dedicated Coronavirus section.
