NEWS OF LIVE SERVICES:

Tomorrow's service in the Benefice on 20th September is here in Great Brickhill, a short service of Holy Communion at 9.30am. It will be a Said service, Common Worship, not the 16662 Common Prayer Book service that our normal Said services are. There will also be a Family service at Little Brickhill at 11.00am.

NEXT SUNDAY, 27th SEPTEMBER is our Harvest Festival at Rectory Farm. The service at 11.00am will be in an open barn, or outside, depending on the current restrictions (which are subject to change) and the weather. After the service all are invited to stay for a bring your own picnic.

We would love to see as many of you as possible at this service but please note the following:

- It would be really helpful to know in advance if you will be coming so that we can make sure that all the necessary precautions are taken
- You can either walk or drive to the farm there will be plenty of parking available
- On arrival contact details will be taken and kept for the mandatory 21 days
- The "Group of Six" rule will be in place
- Please bring a mask with you in case these are required, dependent upon the exact location
- Please bring your own sanitizer, chair, drink and picnic
