The service here in Great Brickhill will be in the church and there will then be a procession to the War Memorial. Under the current restrictions:

- There is still no congregational singing
- Hand sanitizing is required on entry to the church
- Single-use service sheets will be used
- Seating will be in accordance with social distancing rules and the rule of six
- Masks are a mandatory requirement
- We ask for contact details, which we have to keep for 21 days. If you are able to, please use the QR Code on display when you enter the church.

Please note that the arrangements will be in line with the COVID-19 guidelines and so are subject to change.

ONLINE ALPHA COURSE STARTS THIS WEDNESDAY, 4th NOVEMBER AT 8pm

Alpha is an 11-week course where people are brought together for a conversation about faith, life and God. It is an opportunity to explore life's big questions together in an open, informal environment. The episodes explore the basics of the Christian faith, addressing questions such as Who is Jesus? How can we have faith? and How does God guide us?
