GOODBYE AND THANK YOU:

This week we say goodbye to Ted and Mary Maley who are leaving Great Brickhill to start a new life down on the south coast. We would like to offer our heartfelt thanks to them for their huge contribution to life in the village. In particular we would like to thank Mary for her time as a member of the PCC and for setting up and organising the Prayer Group, and Ted for overseeing for many years the arrangements for Remembrance Sunday (please see item below). We send our best wishes to them for their move and hope they settle down well in their new home.

REMEMBRANCE DAY:

Since 2010 we have been very fortunate that Ted Maley has undertaken the organising of the Remembrance Day celebrations. Ted has done this in true military style, leaving no stone unturned to ensure that the service in church and the parade to the wreath laying at our war memorial has been carried out with military precision. Ted will be leaving the village at the end of March and has



left us comprehensive notes for the event. We thank him for his dedication over the last ten years and send our good wishes to both Ted and Mary for their new life on the south coast.

Ted has handed over to David Marlow who served in the Royal Air Force from 1966-83. David graduated from the RAF College Cranwell with a commission and his pilot's wings. He flew the Hercules C130 aircraft worldwide from RAF Lyneham in Wiltshire as an aircraft captain, serving on 24, 30 and LXX Squadrons. He was a flight commander at nearby RAF Halton, near Wendover. He qualified as a flying instructor (QFI), and flew at RAF Linton on Ouse, near York, training students to fly the Jet Provost as they entered pilot training for the RAF.

We are very grateful that David has agreed to work in conjunction with St Mary's Church to organise the Remembrance Day service and to recite the Roll of Honour as the senior ex-serviceman and oversee the arrangements for the parade.

Stefan Kobewka has kindly agreed to organise The Poppy Appeal and the purchase and distribution of the wreaths.

Obituary

Sadly, Jim Hooper, a serviceman from WW2, passed away on 16th February aged 98. A former resident of our village, he was resident in the Blind Veterans UK Centre at Ovingdean near Brighton. Jim took part in Operation Market Garden as an Airspeed Horsa glider pilot. He was transporting troops to take the strategically important bridge at Arnham. This huge airborne force was part of the 35,000 man strong Allied Airborne Army, now immortalised in books and films. Jim was unfortunately captured, became a prisoner of war, and returned to the UK shortly after VE Day.

CENSUS DAY – TOMORROW, SUNDAY 21st MARCH:

We have been asked to circulate the message below from the Diocese of Oxford reminding parishioners about Census day, which is tomorrow.

"The census is coming, and it's about you. Without the information you share, it'd be more difficult to understand your community's needs and to plan and fund public services. By taking part and encouraging your congregation to do the same, you will help inform decisions about the services you and your community need, like doctors' surgeries and new schools. Households will have received letters with online codes explaining how they can complete their forms. If you haven't received one, please get in touch with the census contact centre. You can also request a paper questionnaire if you'd prefer to complete your census that way.

There is lots of support available such as a help area on the census website and a contact centre that can give you help over the phone and guidance in a range of languages and accessible formats, including paper questionnaires and large print. You can also use your postcode to find local census support centres on the census website.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) runs the census in England and Wales and is independent from the government. All information is held securely for 100 years. Statistics are only compiled based on anonymised data and personal information is not shared with any organisation and is never sold.
