The path has had tarmac laid this week but there will be a delay until the resin is available for the final covering.

Fibre optic broadband was installed by Gigaclear on Monday. The wi-fi code will be provided to anyone who will find that useful while at the church. We are indebted to the Oxford Diocese who have awarded us an Internet Connectivity grant to cover the cost of this. Looking to the future, this will be a huge asset and increase the possible future use of the church.
