SUNDAY 27th JUNE 2021: FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Welcome to our service of Holy Communion, led by the Rector. Jerry Breslin and members of the choir will be with us and, if the weather allows, we will sing hymns outside before the start of the service.

It has been a busy week but it does feel as if we are getting back to more normal times. The funeral for Jean Griffiths was held here on Wednesday and yesterday afternoon we were pleased that a baptism service took place, almost a year later than hoped. And today we will have the first reading of banns for Fiona and Vincent's wedding in September, again a year later than originally planned.

Thank you to those who did the flower arrangements for the funeral and to the team who prepared the church ready for the three services over the last few days.
